To Vote 1. Use black or blue ink to mark the ballot. 2. Completely fill in the empty oval to the left of the candidate name or choice in all races you wish to vote. 3. If voting for a Write-In candidate, completely fill in the empty oval to the left of the Write-In selection, then write the name of the write-in candidate in the space provided.	Warning Do <u>NOT</u> use red ink or felt tip pen to mark ballot. Do <u>NOT</u> circle, underline or mark through choices. Do <u>NOT</u> use check marks or X to mark ballot. Do <u>NOT</u> mark more choices per race than allowed. Do <u>NOT</u> sign, cut, tear or damage the ballot.

If you make a mistake or change your mind on a selection:

- A. Do not attempt to mark through the selection or attempt to erase. Write "Spoiled" across the ballot and across the return envelope.
- B. Mail or return the spoiled ballot and envelope to your county board of registrars; a new official absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

If you decide to vote in-person: Surrender the ballot to the poll manager of an early voting site within your county or the precinct to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a regular ballot.

"I understand that the offer or acceptance of money or any other object of value to vote for any particular candidate, list of candidates, issue, or list of issues included in this election constitutes an act of voter fraud and is a felony under Georgia law." City of Atlanta Independent School District Homestead Exemption
(Vote for One)

House Bill 732
Act No. 107

"Shall the Act be approved which provides for the continuation after December 31, 2021, of the homestead exemption from City of Atlanta Independent School District ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$50,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead that exceeds \$10,000.00?"

SPECIAL ELECTION DEKALB COUNTY

DeKalb County ESPLOST
(Vote for One)

Shall the special one percent sales and use tax for educational purposes currently imposed in DeKalb County be reimposed on July 1, 2022, upon the expiration of the currently imposed tax, for not longer than 20 consecutive calendar quarters, to raise not more than \$816,235,158.00 to be used for the following educational purposes:

For the DeKalb County School District: (A) adding to, upgrading, reconfiguring, renovating, replacing, modifying and equipping existing and replacement schools, support facilities, athletic fields and physical education facilities; (B) acquiring and developing land for, constructing and equipping, new and replacement schools and support facilities, as well as additions to existing facilities; (C) installing capital improvements for various existing and new schools, buildings and facilities; (D) providing hardware, software, and related infrastructure and making technology improvements; and (E) replacing, purchasing, upgrading school buses, support vehicles, and other capital equipment, in an amount not to exceed \$742,773,993.78 for the DeKalb County School District, all as more fully described in the Notice of Election.

For the Atlanta Independent School System: (A) for acquiring, reconfiguring and developing land for, constructing and equipping, new and replacement schools and support facilities; (B) adding to, upgrading, reconfiguring, renovating, replacing, modifying and equipping existing and replacement schools, support facilities and athletic facilities; (C) making technology improvements and safety and security improvements for schools and facilities; and (D) acquiring and equipping school buses, school police vehicles, support vehicles, transportation vehicles and other capital equipment. At a total maximum cost of \$32,649,406.32, for the Atlanta Independent School System as more fully described in the Notice of Election.

For the City Schools of Decatur: (A) for the acquisition, construction, renovation, modification, addition, repair, replacement, demolition of, improvement and equipping of existing and new school buildings and other facilities, including other buildings and greenspace useful or desirable in connection therewith; (B) to acquire and install technology improvements throughout the school system, including computers, systems, and related hardware and infrastructure; (C) to acquire school buses, school-related vehicles, and transportation equipment, including infrastructure for electric vehicles; (D) for school and facilities improvement, energy conservation, and maintenance projects; and (E) to acquire supplemental capital equipment for the school system, including any property, real and personal, useful and desirable in connection with the projects listed in the Notice of Election, in an amount not to exceed \$40,811,757.90 for the City Schools of Decatur, all as more fully described in the Notice of Election.
